PURPOSE

1. Responsibility

- 1.1 It is the responsibility of the ATO/Operator to ensure that the applicant is fit to take the examination.
- 1.2 The applicant must be a holder of a valid UAE passport.
- 1.3 The applicant must be a holder of a valid UAE passport and a valid Emirates ID card.
- 1.4 The applicant must be a holder of a valid UAE passport and a valid Emirates ID card, and must be at least 18 years of age.
- 1.5 The applicant must be a holder of a valid UAE passport and a valid Emirates ID card, and must be at least 18 months of age.

5. Licenses Conversion for CAR-FCL ATPL

5.1 The ATPL holder can

7. Passing standards

7.1 A pass in an examination paper will be awarded to an applicant achieving at least 75 % of the marks allocated to that paper. There is no penalty marking.

7.2 Unless otherwise determined in this regulation, an applicant has successfully completed the required theoretical knowledge examination for the appropriate pilot licence or rating when he/she has passed all the required examination papers within a period of 18 months counted from the end of the calendar month when the applicant first attempted an examination.

7.3 Before re-taking the examinations, the applicant shall undertake further training at an ATO. The extent and scope of the training needed shall be determined by the training organisation, based on the needs of the applicant.

8. Written Examination Validity Period

8.1 Theoretical

- a) for a CPL, a period of 24 months;
- b) for a PPL, a period of 36 months;
- c) for a rating, a period of 24 months;
- d) for a ATPL, a period of 7 years;
- e) for a IR, a period of 24 months;
- f) In the case of helicopters, a helicopter's type rating

8.2 Theoretical

- a) for a CPL, a period of 7 years;
- b) for a ATPL, a period of 7 years;
- c) for a MPA-IR, a period of 24 months;

9. Failure

9.1 An applicant who fails an examination on 10 consecutive days.

9.2 If an applicant fails an examination on 10 consecutive days, the applicant shall be required to undertake further training at an ATO. The extent and scope of the training needed shall be determined by the training organisation, based on the needs of the applicant.
